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1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Internet Application
3 Integrity and Disclosure Act" or the "Internet Application
4 I.D. Act".

5 SEC. 2. CHINESE OWNERSHIP DISCLOSURE REQUIRE-6 MENTS.

7 (a) DISCLOSURE.—Any person that maintains an 8 internet website or that sells or distributes a mobile appli-9 cation that is owned, wholly or partially, by the Chinese 10Communist Party or by a non-state-owned entity located 11 in the People's Republic of China, shall disclose to any individual who downloads or otherwise uses such website 12 13 or application, in a clear and conspicuous manner, that such website or application is owned, wholly or partially, 14 15 by the Chinese Communist Party or by a non-state-owned entity located in the People's Republic of China. 16

17 (b) FALSE INFORMATION.—It shall be unlawful for18 any person to knowingly disclose false information under19 this section.

20 SEC. 3. ENFORCEMENT.

(a) UNFAIR OR DECEPTIVE ACTS OR PRACTICES.—
A violation of this Act shall be treated as a violation of
a rule defining an unfair or deceptive act or practice prescribed under section 18(a)(1)(B) of the Federal Trade
Commission Act (15 U.S.C. 57a(a)(1)(B)).

1 (b) POWERS OF THE FEDERAL TRADE COMMIS-2 SION.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The Federal Trade Commission shall enforce this Act in the same manner, by
the same means, and with the same jurisdiction,
powers, and duties as though all applicable terms
and provisions of the Federal Trade Commission Act
(15 U.S.C. 41 et seq.) were incorporated into and
made a part of this Act.

10 (2) PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES.—Any person
11 that violates this Act shall be subject to the pen12 alties, and entitled to the privileges and immunities,
13 provided in the Federal Trade Commission Act (15)
14 U.S.C. 41 et seq.).
